Loran Scholars Foundation is looking for two (2) enthusiastic and dedicated volunteers to serve on the Equity and Inclusivity Advisory Group (EIAG).

EIAG Purpose And Scope

The purpose of the EIAG is to provide informed advice and guidance to the Loran Scholars Foundation (the Foundation) in developing inclusive programs, policies, and practices, and creating a culture and opportunities to candidly discuss and move the agenda forward on equity, inclusion, anti-racism, and anti-oppression, with a focus on addressing systemic oppression, specifically anti-Black racism, anti-Indigenous racism, racism against people of colour, Islamophobia, homophobia, transphobia, and ableism.

Member Duties and Responsibilities

- Advise, support and problem-solve programs, policies, and processes ensuring that these are aligned with the <u>Foundation's Equity</u>, <u>Diversity</u>, <u>Inclusion</u>, <u>and</u> <u>Anti-Racism Framework</u>.
- Work together to monitor the internal accountability framework.
- Monitor program implementation and performance, and advise on promising practices.
- Consider and recommend appropriate ways for the regular input of in-stream scholars, e.g., an annual survey of scholars.
- Demonstrate respect for EIAG members, including the Chair, invited contributors, Foundation staff, and the broader community.
- Respect and give fair consideration to diverse and opposing viewpoints.
- Operate and advise in accordance with the Ontario Human Rights Code and Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms where every member of the Advisory Group has the right to freedom from discrimination or harassment.
- Make every effort to attend scheduled meetings. When conflicts or unforeseen circumstances arise, members should, whenever possible, inform the Foundation of their intended absence.

Recruitment Priorities & Competencies

The Loran Scholars Foundation is committed to diversity, equity, and inclusion and welcomes applications from all qualified community members, particularly from Indigenous, Black, and other historically marginalized communities.

Currently, we are welcoming applications from individuals who have supported Loran applicants, candidates who have been involved with the Loran program as a volunteer and/or scholar, and those who possess and demonstrate an understanding of systemic racism, equity, and inclusion grounded in lived experience. In addition, we are looking for those with competence, skills, and expertise in the following areas:

- Data collection & communication
- Reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples
- Learning and evaluation
- Research

Member Terms

Three years with the possibility for renewal

Meetings:

- Advisory Group members are expected to attend 3 -4 online meetings (usually 2.5 hours and held on weekdays in the afternoon EST)
- Meetings are pre-scheduled in November, March, June (subject to change)
- Meetings are conducted in English

Successful candidates must demonstrate:

- Commitment to the advancement of Loran's equity and inclusion vision and values
- Ability to make the time commitment as detailed above
- Ability to contribute skills and attributes to EIAG discussions and decision-making
- Experience with the Foundation, e.g., as alumnus or volunteers
